Welcome to the second issue of the North Coast Systems Engineer. our enewsletter for the INCOSE Cleveland-Northern Ohio Chapter. The publication of this e-newsletter itself is one indicator of the success we have had as a Chapter in 2009. During the year we affiliated with the Cleveland Engineering Society, we developed several programs for you, from INCOSE certification stories, to presentations on the practice of systems engineering in large and small companies, and within NASA. Our INCOSE Autumn '09 Conference (held in October at the Ohio Aerospace Institute) brought systems methods to bear on power and energy systems via a day and a half of presentations, vendor demos, both of which were accompanied by networking possibilities. A highlight of the year occurred at IS2009, when our chapter was awarded a Bronze Circle Award! One of our major efforts was aimed at developing new members. INCOSE REGION IV FALL CONFERENCE SUMMARY

Our Cleveland Northern Ohio INCOSE chapter took a significant step this past October as host to the successful Region IV Fall Conference, held on October 26 at the elegant, modern facilities of Ohio Aerospace Institute. It was the first major public event and a notable achievement for our chapter and the newly formed INCOSE Power & Energy Systems Working Group, as well as with the participation and partnership of other region IV chapters including Michigan, and the Rochester Finger Lakes region. In addition to our major conference sponsor Hamilton Sunstrand, we were very pleased and gratified for the cooperation of the Great Lakes Science Center, and at the significant support of corporate sponsors such as IBM, AnSYS, PCKA, PPI, QinetiQ, ASRC, Easi, Battelle,

The headline Region IV conference theme was "Using POWER of Applied Systems Methods". It was intended to elevate awareness of advanced SE methods for dealing with complex problems in our modern society, in particular the complex challenges related to solving humanity's energy needs. The program was geared for systems engineers, functional engineers, power & energy specialists, and program managers seeking to create solutions for complex problems. The conference "speakers roster" featured about 12 high-profile, accomplished professionals from industry, academia, and government, providing a wide range of valuable contributions to energy solutions and environment. A unique INCOSE Vision2020 lunchtime presentation was given by Dr. Rich Gryzbowski of Corning Research, also serving as INCOSE Region IV Director. The audience was briefed on the objectives and strategies established at INCOSE for achieving higher levels of Systems Engineering competencies and capabilities. A memorable highlight of the conference was the appearance of our keynote speaker, Dr. Harrison Schmitt, former Senator and Astronaut/Scientist on Apollo 17, the last flight to the moon. As a geologist,

Dr. Schmitt shared his significant insights on the formation of the moon and his findings on lunar soil and rock compositions, some of which may have high potential for future energy development. He further outlined a "systems approach" to lunar development for commercial enterprises in mining the resources of the moon for energy use on earth. Dr. Schmitt also gave an address on Space Exploration at the Great Lakes Science Center as well as recollections on his Apollo 17 lunar experience, to the delight of a packed auditorium including many parents and their young budding astronauts.

Overall participation in the conference exceeded 70 attendees, as well about 6 conference exhibitors. Presentation materials, exhibitor information, and video segments of presentations are to be made available in the near future via the chapter website. (stay tuned for announcements).

The Region IV conference organizing committee worked diligently for nearly a year, developing the program and arranging speakers, exhibitors, logistics, and sponsorship support which enabled a successful outcome. The directly observable result was growth in chapter membership, and a substantial boost to the chapter treasury. The indirect value is the significant elevation of the chapter profile, both within INCOSE as well as the local community and the Power and Energy sector. It also established a key impetus for future such events, building on the foundation of this conference and the numerous positive relationships with leading companies and professionals.
