INTERNATIONAL WORKSHOP 2010 SUMMARY

The International Council on Systems (INCOSE) Engineering International Workshop (IW) was held in Mesa, Arizona. Meetings began on Friday, February 5, 2010. Similar to past years, there was a Model Based Systems Engineering (MBSE) Workshop that ran Friday through Sunday. There was a record attendance of 165 individuals at the MBSE workshop, who heard presentations on demonstration projects and enabling topics, in addition to providing input on the MBSE roadmap and other topics. Friday night saw 152 people emptying 180 bottles of wine (including six from our Chapter) at the Wine Tasting event, which raised \$3800 for the INCOSE Foundation. Working Groups and other meetings began Saturday morning and continued through Tuesday until the Closing Plenary Tuesday afternoon. There were almost 300 attendees from 15 countries at the 2010 IW. Next year's IW is also planned for the Phoenix area.
