INCOSE/CSIP Professional Working Agreement

August, 1999

Purpose:

This professional working agreement is intended to promote systems engineering and related professional areas that are of mutual interest and benefit to the International Council on Systems Engineering (INCOSE) and the Computer Resources (CR) Support Improvement Program (CSIP) and the Software Technology Support Center (STSC).

Background:

As specified in its Program Management Directive, the CSIP Office annually sponsors the Software Technology Conference (STC). CSIP, as the sponsor of the Software Technology Support Center (STSC), tasks the STSC to provide STC conference management services.

Scope:

The Computer Resources Support Improvement Program (CSIP) and the International Council on Systems Engineering (INCOSE) agree to mutual participation as set forth below:

1. STC Advisory Committee. INCOSE participation in the Software Technology Conference (STC) Advisory Committee as a member to participate in the review and allocation of abstracts and final papers to designated STC tracks.
2. STC Track. INCOSE participant will propose a conference track following STC guidelines to the STC Advisory Committee. Once accepted, INCOSE will then sponsor and manage a track.
3. Exhibition Booth Exchange. INCOSE and CSIP/STSC will provide a complimentary booth to the other organization in association their respective conferences. CSIP/STSC will provide INCOSE an STC booth, and INCOSE will provide CSIP/STSC a booth for the INCOSE Annual International Symposium.
4. Mutual Advertisement of Conferences. CSIP/STSC will help promote the INCOSE Annual International Symposium through advertisement in CSIP and STSC web sites and *CrossTalk, the Journal of Defense Software Engineering*. INCOSE will provide the STC with the INCOSE mailing list and will help promote the STC through advertisement in INCOSE web sites and the quarterly published magazine INSIGHT.

Length of Agreement:

This agreement shall remain effective for 2 years as of the date of signature, unless otherwise changed through mutual agreement of both signatories.
