President's Corner



Happy New Year! I hope all of you had a great 2018, both personally and professionally. And my wish for you is a prosperous and productive 2019.

In the last newsletter, I discussed two words – *outreach* and *engagement*. The outreach that Joe Stevens had started and the engagement that I and the Board of Directors are hoping to establish with chapter members. This month, I would like to talk about *value*.

Over the past few months there has been an ongoing dialogue among the chapter leaders in the INCOSE Americas Sector regarding the value of an INCOSE membership. It was all about how we promote INCOSE to new members and retain current members.

One theme was a feeling that we do not do a good job of making members aware of the benefits. That will be something I plan to do more of as I interact with you and potential members. transmit a speaker and presentation. Right now the chapter does not have access to those, but the Board and I will continue to try to figure out how we can.

While remote broadcasts are something that would benefit groups of members, it was also pointed out that personal, face-to-face interaction is critical to maintaining the feeling of belonging to the Chapter. Which leads back to the engagement aspect. I would encourage all of you to attend chapter events and get to know other chapter members, as together we can make a stronger chapter.

So what value do you want to get out of your INCOSE membership? I was just thinking about advertisements I heard a few months ago for 2019 season tickets for the Cedar Point Amusement Park. They implied by purchasing then, you would get the best value. But what if you bought season tickets and never went? Would that be such a great value? So I encourage you to get involved and get the full value out of your INCOSE membership. If there is something else the Chapter can be doing to help you get that full value, feel free to reach out to me or other Board members.
