

# C-NO Outreach Event at Case Western Reserve University – April 26, 2019

Several Cleveland-Northern Ohio Chapter members participated in an outreach event with systems engineering students at Case Western Reserve University on April 26, 2019. For the past two years the C-NO Chapter Board of Directors has sought to engage with local engineering students to identify their needs coming into the workforce and to let them know what participating in INCOSE can offer them.

One of our stalwart CWRU systems engineering student leaders, JC Schmidt, introduced the panel members: Dennis Rohn (Chapter President, 2018/2019), Tim Schuler (Chapter Secretary, 2018/2019), Justin Fada (NASA Systems Engineer, recent CWRU graduate), Bill Klinger

(Chapter Past-President, CWRU alumnus), Cody Farinacci (Chapter Past-President), and Brian Hallett (Chapter member) to an enthusiastic audience of approximately 15 students and faculty. Dennis presented an overview of INCOSE and systems engineering resources available to members. He then introduced the panel. Each panelist began with a 5 minute introduction of themselves including a summary of their career roles and experiences as systems engineers.

Some thoughts from Justin as a relatively recent engineering graduate: "show how you have taken on additional responsibilities and show your value." The discussion was so absorbing for all, that we eventually were kicked out of the room by an incoming class!

# Seeking candidates for INCOSE C-NO Chapter Officers

Fellow Cleveland-Northern Ohio Chapter members,

Last fall, the Board of Directors deferred the normal Chapter election cycle due to the transition from the 2018 President to myself as an interim President for the Chapter. The Americas Sector leadership also asked that we make sure the chapter was "re-established" before trying to conduct elections, which factored in to the decision. The other reason for the delay was because we felt it important to take a look at restructuring the Board of Directors before holding elections. The Chapter recently approved the Bylaw revisions that changes the elected leadership from President, Vice/President-Elect, Past President, Treasurer, and Secretary, to President, Vice President, At-large Director, Treasure, and Secretary. Each position now serves a nominal one-year term.

Having the new by-laws in place, it is now time to conduct elections for the 2019 officers. We are in the process of trying to establish a Nominations & Elections Committee to conduct the elections, but in the meantime, I wanted to encourage all of you to consider running for one of the five positions. My goal is to have candidates identified this month, conduct the elections in

June (a 30 day period) and have the new officers begin in July. Because we got off cycle, the 2019 officers would only need to serve from July until January. (a new election cycle would occur this fall to elect 2020 officers)

So please consider serving the Chapter in an elected position. If you have any questions about the responsibilities, feel free to reach out to me or the other current officers (Marina Cronin and Tim Schuler). If you aren't able to be an elected officer, but would like to get involved, we could use additional volunteers on the Nominations & Elections Committee too. If you are interested in either an elected position, or on the committee, let me know (until the Committee is established).

#### **GLRC**

The deadline for submissions of proposed presentations and panel sessions has been extended. It would be great to see more presentations from our local Chapter. Please consider submitting a proposed presentation.

The theme of this year's GLRC is "Giant Leaps with Systems Engineering." The conference program will reflect on significant accomplishments of systems engineering, including celebration of the 50th Anniversary of Apollo. Looking ahead to the next 50 years, the GLRC13 will explore the possibilities with systems engineering in meeting the challenges of today and in the future. The conference is being be held in conjunction with EnergyTech 2019 at the Cleveland I-X Center, the week of October 21. Tuesday, October 22, and Wednesday, October 23, will feature presentations mostly focused on systems engineering applied to terrestrial and aerospace energy systems. Wednesday, October 23, and Thursday, October 24, will feature presentations on systems engineering and systems engineering applied to other types of systems. It is anticipated that the week will also include full and half day tutorials. On Friday morning, October 25, the INCOSE Certified Systems Engineering Professional exam will be offered for free. Several exciting speakers are also being planned, including Astronaut Harrison Schmidt, who also spoke at the GLRC held in Cleveland in 2009. Planning is being done by a regional team made up of individuals from Chapters in the region.
