In Remembrance of Marton Forkosh....

The Cleveland-Northern Ohio Chapter lost one of its founders, when Marton Forkosh passed away on July 14, 2021. Marton joined INCOSE in 2000 and frequently attended International

Symposia and Workshops. Through this and his leadership in the NASA Glenn Research Center systems engineering organization, he wondered if it would make sense to have a Cleveland based INCOSE chapter. John Juhasz, one of the other founders, reflected that "I remember well how - at the IW 07 in Albuquerque where we had a

breakfast meeting - he enthusiastically supported the local chapter formation, and provided solid ideas for its successful evolution."

As a result of that breakfast meeting, a few of us began planning to organize a chapter and held our first meetings in the summer of 2007. Without Marton, the Cleveland-Northern Ohio Chapter may never have been formed. While never serving as a Chapter officer, Marton always supported the Chapter and encouraged fellow employees to join. Many folks are appreciative of his efforts over the years. One of our Chapter's earlier members, Bill Klinger shared "I applaud his pioneering work in helping to found and support the Chapter."

Marton was also active in INCOSE at the International level, and occasionally he would even sit in on Corporate Advisory Board meetings as the NASA representative. Through the years I had numerous opportunities to travel with Marton for INCOSE Symposia and Workshops. He was always fun to travel with and I would like to share recollections from one such INCOSE trip.

In 2005, we travelled to the INCOSE International Symposium, which was being held in Rochester, NY. One evening, he and I took a walk around the city to see some sights. We came across a restaurant where several other INCOSE members we sitting out on a patio area. Marton walked over to say hello to them, and it seemed like he knew all of them, including the

then President of INCOSE. He was like that, he got to know so many people and they knew him as well.

During that same trip, we decided to drive to a nearby restaurant that was housed in an Erie Canal era tavern. It was there that I became aware of how well Marton knew wines. We decided to have a glass of wine while waiting for our meal and he quickly selected one off of their wine list. It

turned out to be the best red wine that I have ever had. He made a great selection.

Marton, not only help found the local Chapter, but also aided the International organization in outreach to Russian systems engineers, helping them to establish a Russian INCOSE Chapter.

Marton will be fondly remembered for his positive impact on systems engineering within NASA, within the international INCOSE community, within the local INCOSE community, and on me.

DSM 2021 - Just Enough Systems Engineering without Going Broke!

The annual DSM Conference was held virtually October 12-14th. Bill Klinger and Carl Dister from our chapter presented a paper along with a professional auditor, Denise Hunter on how to optimize the use of internal controls or management practices using network theory. We have often heard organizations complain that trying to be perfect at each INCOSE practice is impractical. However, how can you optimize your organization's Systems Engineering practices without going broke? The paper explains a method based upon the N-Squared in the INCOSE Handbook and uses a simple spreadsheet.
