



INCOSE Past President John Snoderly (2002-2003)

John Snoderly was the first President of the Washington Chapter of the International Council on Systems Engineering INCOSE in 1991. Dr. Snoderly was the President of INCOSE from 2002-2004.

He is Co-Author of the 1994 IEEE 1220 Systems Engineering Standard. He received a Doctor of Public Administration Degree from USC in December of 1996. He received a Masters Degree in Public Administration from USC in May 1995. He also holds a Master Degree in Systems Management from USC in 1973 and a Bachelor of Science in Aerospace Engineering from WVU.

Dr. Snoderly is currently the Program Director of Systems Engineering at the Defense Acquisition University. He is responsible for the development of SE courses as well as providing instruction on management of the Systems Engineering aspects of the Department of Defense systems acquisition process.

Prior to joining the College in 1979, Professor Snoderly was the Deputy Program Manager for the U.S. Navy LAMPS MK III Program at the Naval Air Systems Command. His accomplishments include presenting a report to the Secretary of the Navy that was instrumental in the program's successful completion of the Full Scale Development Phase. He was a member of the LAMPS Program Office for six years.

Professor Snoderly has 16 years of engineering and management experience working for the U.S. Navy as a civilian engineer. His recommendations were instrumental in the development and fielding of the Navy LAMPS MK III weapons system.
