Screening Test:

Equivalent Project Screening Test Question:
The project thinks it is directed by factors outside its control
The project believes it has been given direction, but there is no evidence of this
The project is unable to clearly express its vision and purpose

The project thinks it is misunderstood
The project does not believe in requirements because it cannot tell if they are real or not
The project has to test everything because it cannot trust its analyses and models
The project is overly optimistic despite the evidence
The project believes that others in the business want it to fail
The project believes it is unfairly treated because of its success and abilities
The project believes it has been given direction, but there is no evidence of this

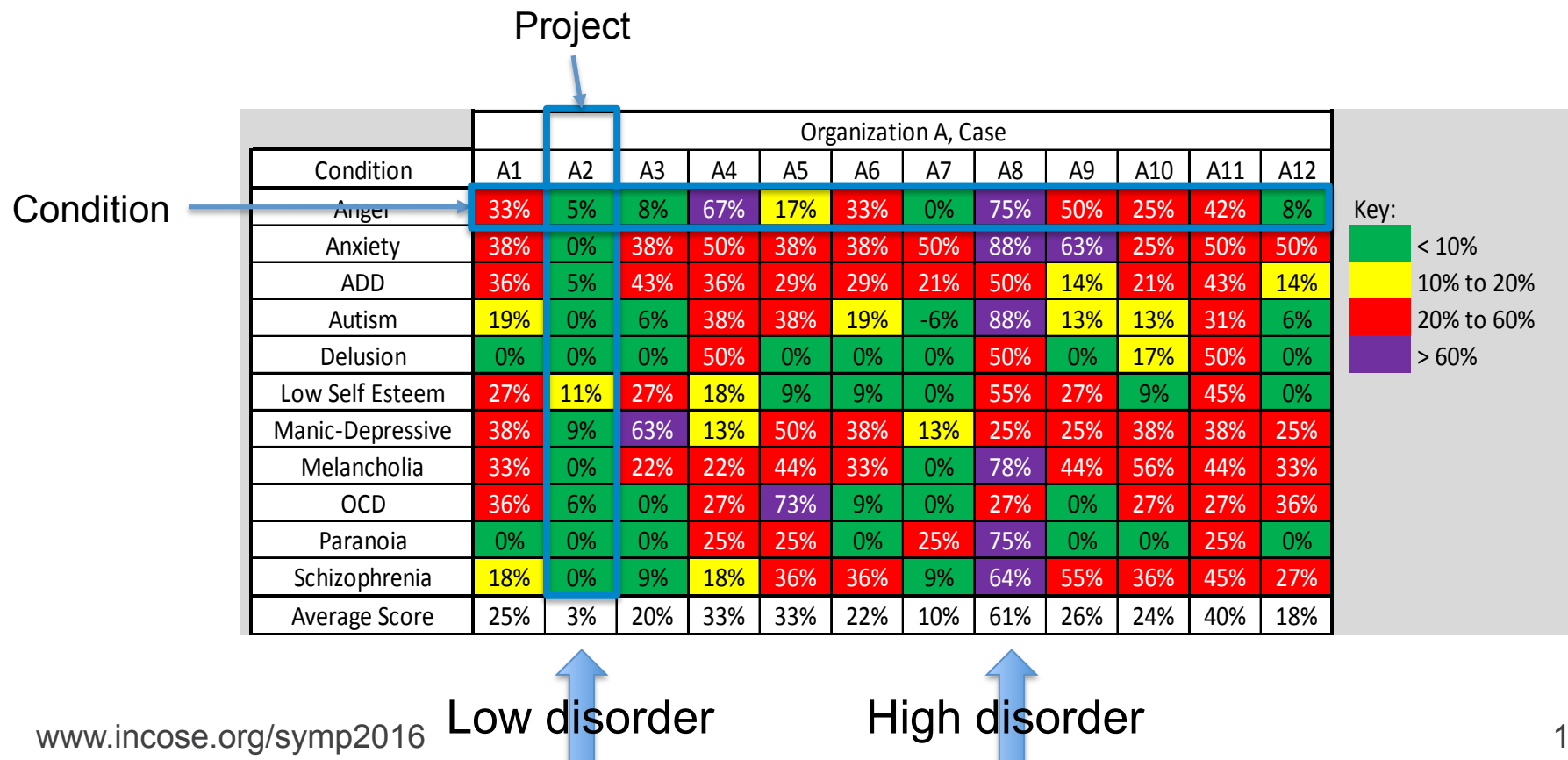
Project Treatment

Treatment Options	Equivalent Project Action Options:
Establish a daily routine for the patient to follow.	Establish and stabilize plans and procedures to follow
Help the patient stay on the medication.	Do compliance checks and progress reviews, introduce metrics and monitors
Keep the lines of communication open about problems or fears the patient may have.	Regular reporting and feedback of issues and risks
Understand that caring for the patient can be emotionally and physically exhausting. Take time for yourself.	Make sure that mentors and trainers are available but not sucked totally into the project - stay independent
Keep your communications simple and brief when speaking with the patient.	Keep project presentations and reporting clear and succinct
Be patient and calm.	Be patient and calm
Ask for help if you need it; join a support group.	Establish communities of practice so that the team doesn't feel isolated

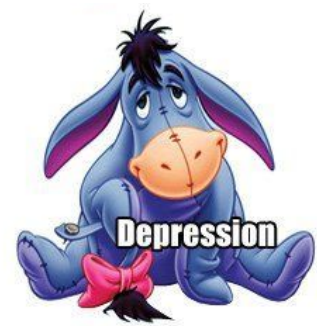
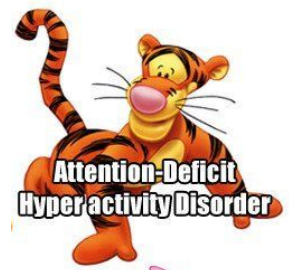
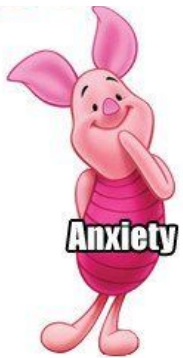
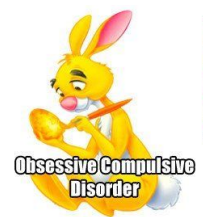
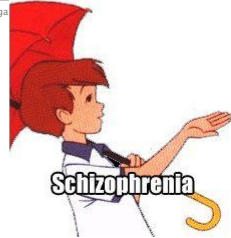
Evaluation Observations

- One person, one project
 - Some conditions more common in projects, some less
- One person, more projects
 - May encounter “condition blindness”
- More persons, one project
 - One project can show consistent diagnoses among evaluators
 - Project score can vary by evaluator
 - Differences in scoring may be related to the evaluator’s role (PM vs. Team member)

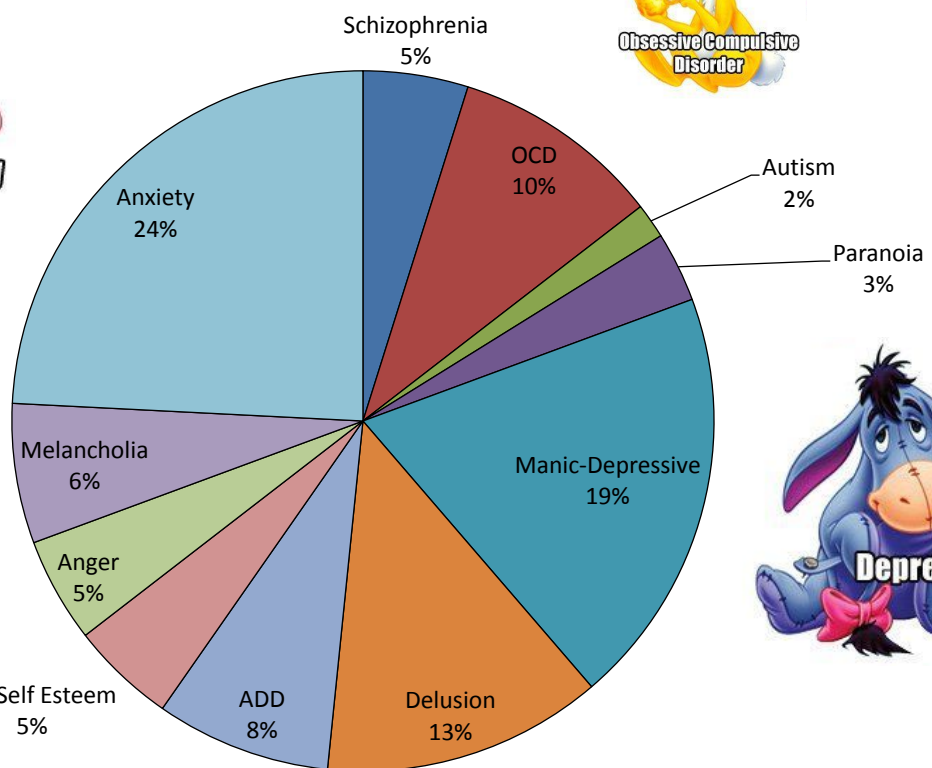


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First or Second Ranked Conditions
