a language informed by social consciousness to generate innovative systems (product design and deployment).



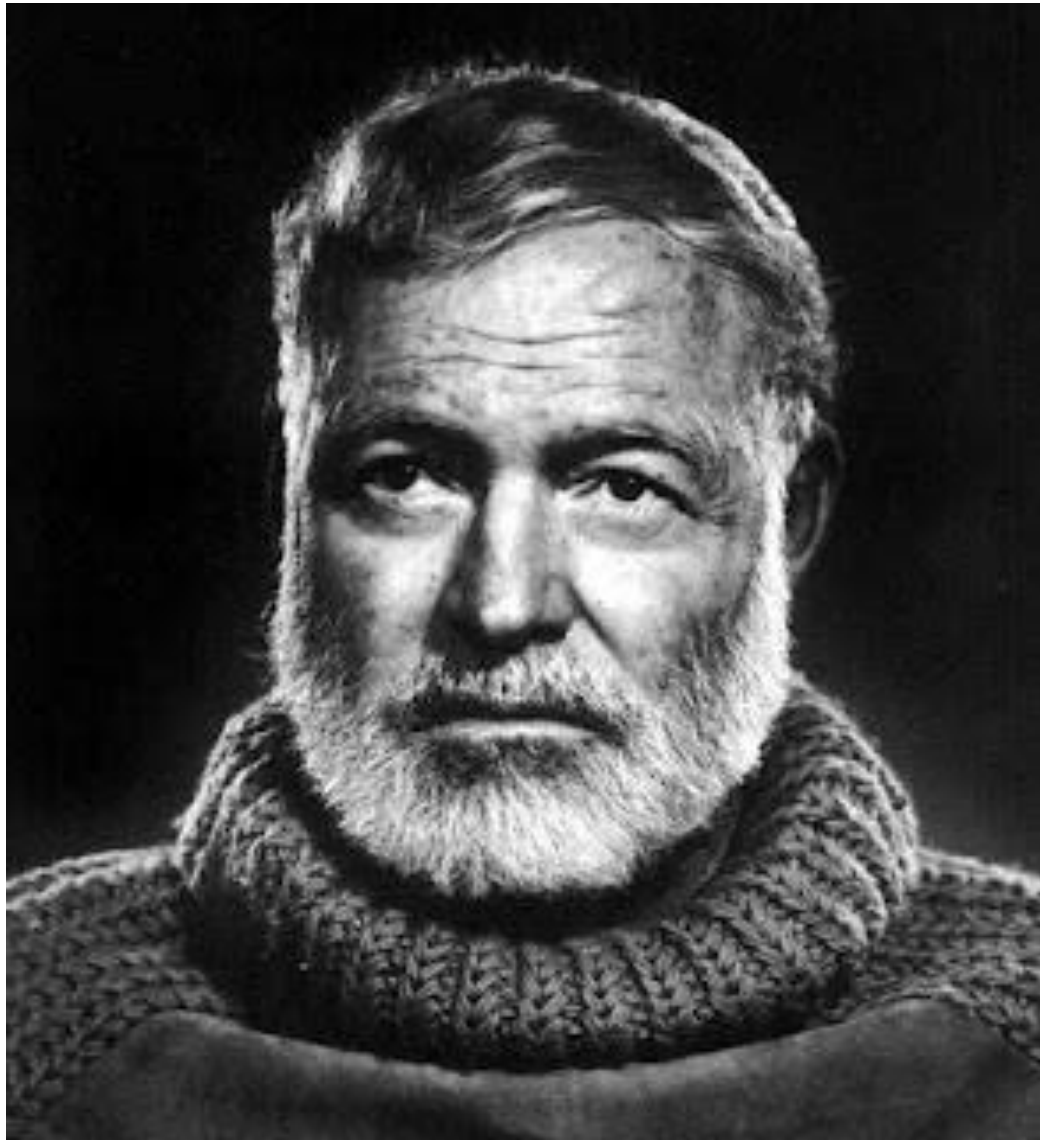
